page
Markers or crayons
Construction paper
(optional)
Scissors (optional)
Glue (optional)

Directions:

- In each of the rainbow lines write the Sheva Mitzvot Bnei Noach
- Color in each line with your rainbow. Use standard rainbow colors or get creative and mix it up
- Cut out the rainbow and paste it on the construction paper

Tip: The standard rainbow colors known by the acronym ROY G BIV are red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet.

 - 5. Do not steal
- 6. Don't eat meat taken from a live animal7. Pursue justice
