## Nathalie's birthday - Category 2 – Subcategory: Stealing

Granny is allergic to a variety of things, therefore Mother has purchased and arranged specific items for her. It gets packed in the afternoon. There are numerous family members and friends. Everyone is having a good time and eating tasty food.

Nathalie enjoys whatever her mother cooks. But that little table...it piques her interest. She approaches it and examines it carefully. It appears to be satisfactory. "Don't touch it, that's for Grandma," her mother says in her brain. Would Grandma mind if she tried just one biscuit? Would it be noticed if she ate one?

Nathalie takes one biscuit and devours it. Is that right or wrong?



**The ethical question** that arises here is how Nathalie should handle the temptation to eat something from the small table of treats that have been set out specifically for her grandmother, even though her mother has forbidden it. The ethical considerations in this situation include:

Respect for the wishes and needs of others: Nathalie's mother has clearly indicated that the treats on the small table are intended for her grandmother, who has allergies. Respecting her grandmother's wishes and needs is important out of compassion and consideration for her grandmother's health.
